

Classroom Set up

Like I said in my philosophy I like to have a lot of different materials and activities within my classroom. I want a lot of different centers that let my students explore and try new things throughout the classroom. For desk set up, I like the idea of pods or all desks in a U shape facing the front of the classroom. Each desk will have a nametag on each so students feel like they have space that they can call their own. If there are pods, I like the idea of nametags along with a box at each pod with extra markers, pens, pencils, erasers, etc. I also like the kidney shaped table so I can have one on one time with students. As shown in the diagram, I will also have an area in the back of the classroom for circle time where we will have morning meetings and different whole group's discussions or activities. Finally, an area for students to play and explore different activities and materials.



3. Plan for First Week

The first few days in any classroom for any age all start out with going over procedures, guidelines, class expectations, along with different aspects of the classroom. The age I want to focus on for my final paper is second grade. To start off with my first week agenda, the first day would be really basic and simple. As the students enter the classroom, I would show the students were their desks and cubies are and where to put their backpacks and coats.

Next, I would go through the morning routine. This including how to take lunch count and attendance, for this I like to have all the names of the students on the active board or use an magnetic board with their names on a magnet to put in the desired lunch spot. For the active board, they then have to come to the board and move their name to one of the three options; hot lunch, sack lunch from home, or salad/sandwich. I would also like to have a morning meeting with the students where we would go over the agenda for the day and talk about the worksheet or reading assignment they would have on their desk every morning when they arrive to school. Each morning assignment would be on their desk ready for them to complete right away when they arrive in the morning.

When first arriving at the morning meeting on the first day of school, I would have a little presentation of myself. I would create a PowerPoint that showed pictures of my family and friends, along with some things I like to do. I think morning meetings are important so I would have one ever day. "During the meeting, the schedule for the day is shared, as well as important upcoming dates and events.....The Morning Meeting is a time when students can bring up any relevant issues that may be bothering them" (page 171, Wong). These meetings are important to me because it can let me see where every child is at every day. I like to have a morning quote or message to leave the students to think about during the day as well. Some may have had a rough

night or morning with parents or family so letting them let it all out before we start can help a ton to a good rest of the day. I would then play a "get to know you" game with the whole class. This may consist with either a "get to know you bingo" game or a "shoe talk" game for example. The shoe talk game is where the class divides up into two teams and puts one shoe in a big bag. Students then take turns taking out a shoe and finding the owner and then asks different questions. Of course, different games are for different ages, but I thought these two are pretty fun.

From there I would go over bathroom and drink procedures. I like using different hand signals such as students holding up a one for going to get a drink and a two for going to the bathroom. The student will then grab either the "Boys Bathroom", "Girls Bathroom", or the "Drink Pass" and put it on their desk. I like using this method because if I am talking to a student on something, that certain student just has to hold up a number and I can tell them either yes or no. With explaining the bathroom procedure, I would also tell them when they can go to the bathroom unless it is an emergency. The times to use the bathroom would be either during worktime, snack, or before we would go to a special. Going off of that, we would talk about the voice level to use in the bathroom, how much soap to use, or how much paper towel to use. With the younger students it is very important to go through every step and model for them on how to do it. Finally, on the first day, I would introduce them to some attention getters that I will be using throughout the year. An example would be I say "1, 2, 3 eyes on me" and the students say "1, 2 eyes on you", along with many others that will be taught throughout the days to come.

The second day would consist of a variety of things including talking about the voice meter and what levels are used at what times or activities. I like the voice meter because then the

students have certain expectations that they are accountable for. The first and second day would also be teaching them how to line up and what a line looks like and sounds like when going to different specials, lunch, or recess. As far as lining up, I would like to have a line of tape on the floor so they know where to line up, I saw this in my practicum and I really loved it. I would also teach the point system I would have in my classroom. Each row or pod would be given a number and if they did their job quickly and quietly or came to the carpet without talking or distractions, they would get an award at the end of the month or week. Either at the end of the first day or explain it more the second day, I would go over class jobs and what group is assigned to do what. I like the idea of class jobs because again it holds a responsibility for each student. Again like the first day, I would keep repeating different attention getters that I would use within my classroom. Finally, I also love the idea of having the students explore the classroom and different materials within it. Giving the students an idea of what they have to work with.

The next few days would consist of more of the specific stuff and possibly getting into a little bit of work. I would explain to them the take home folders and the expectations behind those, along with where to hand in assignments or late work. I also like the idea of if my desks are not in pods and are not accessible to "pod boxes"-which have extra pencils, markers, crayons, erasers, etc. within them- I would have extra supplies in the back of the room. I like this idea because then students do not have to worry about not having a pencil or marker. Anyway to make them feel like they belong and feel safe in my classroom is my main goal. Within these next few days I would also explain to them different groups for "daily 5" and what to do for the different math groups that will also be happening on a given day. Just like the first few days, repetition of attention getters and little reminders of how a proper line looks or the voice level

when we are heading to gym class. Yes explaining these procedures are important, but modeling and going through what a certain action looks like and doesn't look like I think is very important.

As far as different strategies to handle inappropriate behaviors go I think it is important to pick your battles and let other things go. Different battles can be diminished by giving the student a choice, for example, "you can either do your math worksheet not or with me at recess". Just using different strategies to avoid conflict as much as possible. Going off of Love and Logic talking about rules and consequences, I think it is important to create classroom rules or guidelines with your class. I want my class to be a part of making the rules so they know what is expected of them.

I also want to inforce the idea of handling problems right away and not waiting until the next day or later that day to handle it. Instead of yelling at the student and calling them out I like the approach of taking that student(s) aside and going through the situation with them and asking why they felt like they needed to do what they did or what happened. Calmly talking to them on how to maybe handle things differently and make a plan when they feel worked up or upset about something. The steps to take if misbehavior would happen would be to work it out and make a plan with the student, and then if that does not work have a meeting with the student and the parents. With situations like these, I want to have a calming or safe place in my classroom for the students to go and just relax, take a breath and regroup. Working on preventing things before they happen again. I also like the idea of talking with the student and asking them what I can do to help them in different situations, this can help them feel that I am here to help and not just yell at them. Also off Love and Logic and being a coach, I love the saying "I love and care about you too much to argue".

All in all I want my students to know that they can trust me and that I care about them. I love idea of having choice and variety in my classroom so all learners feel that they can reach their full potential. I also want the students to be involved with making the rules and guidelines. I want to be a teacher that leaves an impact on all my students and know that they leave my classroom knowing that they are loved and cared about.






Voice Meter:







Bathroom/Drink Pass:



Calming Corner/Safe Place and instructions on how to calm down:










An example of how I would want to put a container filled with extra materials on each desk if my desk arrangement was in pods.
