Try to be one step ahead so that you are using your observations of skill and development to plan and prepare the lesson rather than having to adjust the lesson so much when you are implementing.

Suggestions for Improvement:	In your next practicum focus on several instructional strategies. Push yourself to explore options and varying how you use your tool kits. Many of your lessons were teacher guided. Think about how to formulate peer guided, teacher directed, student guided, etc. You did a nice job adjusting instruction on the fly and being responsive to learners. As indicated above, with more understanding of where learners are at before you plan the lesson, you may not have to work so hard at adapting.

Suggestions for Improvement:	Work on developing an organizational system to help you understand the expectations of assignments and tasks. Although I appreciate that you ask clarifying questions, sometimes you asked the same questions on several occasions. I believe part of this comes from your desire to do it right and be successful. Reflect on what you need as a learner to process the information so that you only need to ask a clarifying question once instead of 3-4 times.
